Senior Biography

Maximum 150 words

Your senior biography is a brief overview of your student's homeschool journey, accomplishments, interests, and future plans. It will be included in commencement materials and may be read or referenced during the ceremony.

Can Include:

- Birth information
- Accomplishments / Academic Achievements
- Extracurricular Activities / Volunteer service / Hobbies / Special Interests
- Future Educational Plans or Career Goals
- Expressions of Gratitude
- Favorite Bible verse - verse not included in word

Parent Charge

Maximum 150 words

A Parent Charge is a special message written by a parent or guardian to their graduating senior. This meaningful message will be read aloud by our speaker during the diploma and tassel presentation at the commencement ceremony.

Your Parent Charge may include:

- A favorite Bible verse or passage

- A prayer, blessing, or words of encouragement for your senior
- Reflections on your student's journey and accomplishments
- Inspirational, heartfelt, or even humorous memories and advice

Graduate Thank You

Maximum 75 words

One of the most meaningful moments of the commencement ceremony is the **Graduate Thank You**. Each graduate will have the opportunity to record a personal message of appreciation that will be played during the ceremony as a surprise for their parents or guardians.

This message should come from **your heart** and reflect your own words. Think about the love, encouragement, sacrifices, guidance, and support your parents or guardians have given you throughout your homeschool journey.

Please **do not ask your parents to proofread your message or email it for you**—we want this to be a heartfelt surprise they will hear for the first time during the ceremony.

Your recorded message should be **75 words or fewer**.

Senior Picture Submission (5 Photos Required)

The senior slideshow is one of the most meaningful parts of the commencement ceremony. These photos allow family and friends to watch each graduate's journey from infancy to graduation.

Please submit **five (5) high-quality digital photos** in the following order:

1. **Baby Photo** (Infant or toddler)
2. **Growing Up Photo #1** (Early childhood)
3. **Growing Up Photo #2** (Elementary or middle school years)
4. **Growing Up Photo #3** (Later middle school or high school)
5. **Senior Portrait** (Current senior photo)

Photo Guidelines

- Submit **high-resolution digital images** whenever possible. Original files are preferred.
- Photos should be **clear, well-lit, and in focus**.
- Avoid screenshots, photos of printed photographs, heavily filtered images, or images with text or graphics added.
- Please choose photos that are appropriate for a family-friendly graduation ceremony. While that adorable naked baby picture may be a treasured family memory, please select a photo where your graduate is appropriately clothed.
- Whenever possible, choose photos that prominently feature **only the graduate**. If others appear in the image, the graduate should remain the clear focus.
- Both color and black-and-white photos are welcome.

Tips for the Best Slideshow

- Select photos that highlight different stages of your graduate's life.
- Include a variety of smiles, hobbies, interests, or milestones that reflect your graduate's personality.
- If your senior portrait is professionally taken, submit the original high-resolution file whenever available.

Guest Photography Guidelines

To ensure every family has an enjoyable viewing experience and our photographer can capture each graduate without interruption:

- Flash photography is not permitted during the ceremony.
- Guests should remain seated and refrain from standing in aisles to take photos.
- Please do not block the view of other guests or interfere with the professional photographer.

12. Reserved Family Seating

Each graduate receives **six (6) reserved seats** for family members.

Reserved seating is intended for:

- Parents
- Siblings
- Grandparents

Parents should plan to sit on an aisle, as they will be invited to join their graduate on stage during the **Presentation of the Diploma** and **Turning of the Tassel**. Siblings and grandparents will remain seated while parents participate in this special portion of the ceremony.

Need More Than Six Seats?

We are pleased to offer additional open seating throughout the auditorium. Families who require more than the six reserved seats are welcome to invite additional guests.

Additional seating is available on a **first-come, first-served basis**. Guests wishing to sit together are encouraged to arrive early to select seats in the open seating sections before the ceremony begins.

Our venue offers ample seating, and we look forward to celebrating this special day with all of your family and friends!

13. Graduate Seating & Processional Requests

Graduates will be assigned seating for the commencement ceremony and rehearsal. If you would like to sit next to a particular graduate or walk in the processional with a friend, PPEA must know today if you have a request.

While we cannot guarantee every request, we will do our best to accommodate reasonable requests when creating the seating chart and processional lineup.

14. Senior Display Table (Optional)

Families who wish to create a special display honoring their graduate may reserve a **Senior Display Table**. Set up in the multipurpose room for viewing after the commencement ceremony, this optional display provides an opportunity to celebrate your graduate's journey and share memories with family, friends, and fellow graduates attending the commencement ceremony.

Your display is a reflection of your graduate's unique story and can be as simple or elaborate as you choose. It may include a **memory board, trifold display, framed photos, scrapbook, memorabilia, keepsakes, or a combination of these items**. There is no required format—families are encouraged to create a display that best represents their graduate.

Ideas for your display include:

- Baby, childhood, and senior photos
- School memories and milestones
- Awards, achievements, and certifications
- Extracurricular activities, sports, clubs, and volunteer experiences
- Hobbies, interests, and talents
- A favorite Bible verse, inspirational quote, or life motto
- College, career, military, or future plans (optional)
- Photos with family and friends

Display Guidelines

- Each graduate will be provided approximately **3 feet of table space**.
- Tables are covered with a black tablecloth and are typically shared with one other graduate.
- Families may bring an additional decorative table covering if desired.
- Please keep all items within your assigned space.
- Clearly display your graduate's name.
- Candy, a guest book, and a card basket are welcome.
- Electrical outlets are limited. If your display requires power, please bring an extension cord.
- Please review all photos and wording to ensure they are appropriate for a family audience and reflective of the Christian values of our commencement ceremony. Nude baby photos are not permitted.

*** Available by request only. If you would like to share a table with another graduate, please indicate this when requesting table space. We will do our best to accommodate your request.**

15. Graduate Cap, Gown and Dress Code

To ensure a polished and unified appearance, all graduates participating in the PPEA Commencement Ceremony are required to wear the official PPEA cap, gown, and tassel provided through the PPEA Graduation Program. Personal caps, gowns, or tassels may not be substituted.

The following dress code applies to **both the Senior Brunch (official class photo) and Commencement**.

Ladies

- Dress or skirt no shorter than 5 inches above the knee and no longer than the graduation gown.
- Dress shoes (open or closed toe).
- No flip-flops, tennis shoes, or boots.

Gentlemen

- Dress shirt and tie.
- Dark dress pants.
- Dark dress shoes.

Commencement

- Your official PPEA cap, gown, and tassel.
- Graduates are encouraged to wear business or dress attire beneath their gown.

Graduation Cap Decorations

Graduates are welcome to decorate their graduation caps. Decorations must follow these guidelines:

- Must remain entirely on the top (flat surface) of the cap.
- May not extend more than **1 inch** above the cap.
- May not hang over the edges of the cap.
- No exposed cords, wiring, or moving parts.
- Battery-operated lights are permitted but must remain **off** during the ceremony.
- Decorations must be appropriate for a family-friendly event. PPEA reserves the right to require the removal of any decoration deemed inappropriate or distracting.

16. Honors Regalia

PPEA recognizes the unique educational journeys of homeschool students and encourages families to celebrate their graduate's accomplishments.

Graduates may also wear approved honors earned through other educational programs or organizations, including:

- Honor cords awarded through a college or dual enrollment program, such as **St. Petersburg College**.
- Honor stoles or regalia awarded through homeschool programs or co-ops, including **Chosen, Classical Conversations, Wellmont**, or similar organizations.
- Military or service-related regalia earned through approved organizations such as **ROTC, Civil Air Patrol**, or similar programs.

Honor cords, stoles, and other academic regalia are not included with graduation registration and must be purchased separately by each family. Appendix B

Honors Regalia

PPEA recognizes the unique educational journeys of homeschool students and encourages families to celebrate their graduate's accomplishments.

Graduates may also wear approved honors earned through other educational programs or organizations, including:

- Honor cords awarded through a college or dual enrollment program, such as **St. Petersburg College**.
- Honor stoles or regalia awarded through homeschool programs or co-ops, including **Chosen, Classical Conversations, Wellmont**, or similar organizations.
- Military or service-related regalia earned through approved organizations such as **ROTC, Civil Air Patrol**, or similar programs.

Honor cords, stoles, and other academic regalia are not included with graduation registration and must be purchased separately by each family. Families may purchase honor cords and stoles from **any vendor of their choice**. Many families find **Amazon** offers the largest selection of colors at affordable prices.

PPEA Suggested Honor Cord Guidelines

Because every homeschool student's educational journey is unique, PPEA provides the following suggested guidelines to assist families in recognizing academic achievement. These recommendations are intended to provide consistency while allowing parents the flexibility to determine which honors best reflect their graduate's accomplishments.

Please Note: These honor cord guidelines are suggestions provided by PPEA and are not intended to replace or supersede honors awarded by colleges, universities, homeschool programs, or other educational organizations.

- **English** - White

4 credits or more with a minimum GPA of 3.5

- **Mathematics** - Light Blue

4 credits or more of a college- prep mathematics program (Algebra I, Geometry, Advanced Algebra (II), Pre-Calculus and/or Calculus) with a minimum GPA of 3.5

- **Science** - Burgundy

4 credits or more of science with a minimum GPA of 3.5 including at least 2 of the following courses: Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Anatomy & Physiology

- **Social Studies** - Navy Blue

4 credits or more with a minimum GPA of 3.5. Possible classes include: US History, Government, British History, World History

- **World Languages** - Red

4 credits or more of the same Foreign Language with a minimum GPA of 3.

- **Fine Arts** -Forest Green

Art: at least 3 credits with a minimum GPA of 3.5

Music: active in a band, vocal, choir or instrumental music program for at least 3 years with a minimum GPA 3.5

- **Technology** - Copper

3 credits or more of technology courses with a minimum GPA of 3.5

- **College Credit** - Royal Blue

Completing college classes that result in earning college credit

- **Business** - Red, White & Blue

3 credits earned in business classes with a minimum GPA of 3.5

Computer classes may be counted, as well as job experience

- **Community Service:**

Purple - 100+ Hours of Community Service

Silver - 250+ Hours of Community Service

- **Military** - Black

Participation in ROTC, Civil Air Patrol, or similar program

- **Perseverance** - Pink

Awarded to a student who has demonstrated perseverance

Honor Societies (Gold)

There is a chapter of the National Honor Society for homeschoolers, Graduates who are members of recognized honor societies may also wear the regalia associated with those organizations. Examples include:

Timeline of Events

Saturday, April 10, 2027

Senior Graduation Brunch

10:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m.

Starkey Road Baptist Church - Multipurpose Room

This event marks the official kickoff to graduation season and is an important planning meeting for all graduating seniors and their families.

During the Brunch

- Receive your cap and gown.
- Take the official Senior Class Photo for the graduation program.
- Graduates record their “Thank You” message.
- Select your senior display table.
 - If you would like to share a table with another graduate, please notify us so that we can plan the layout accordingly.
- Reserve seating for your immediate family. (Six Seats Max)
- Fellowship with fellow graduates
- Last chance to notify PPEA if you have seating or processional request

Students should wear dressy attire similar to what they plan to wear during graduation.

Friday, May 14, 2027

Graduation Rehearsal

4:00 p.m. – 8:00 p.m.

Starkey Road Baptist Church

Attendance is required for both graduates and parents. If you will be participating on stage during the ceremony, you must attend rehearsal.

This is a **dress rehearsal**. Graduates should arrive dressed exactly as they will for graduation. Please review the attire guidelines for PPEA graduates.

Cap & Gown Check-In

Bring your official cap, gown, and tassel to the **Rehearsal Dinner**. Gowns should be clean, pressed, and hung on a hanger. Place your cap and tassel in a bag attached to the hanger. Your cap and gown will be labeled with your name and stored in the graduates' dressing room until Commencement to help prevent anything from being forgotten on graduation day.

Graduation cap decorations are permitted provided they:

- Remain completely on the top of the cap.
- Do not extend more than one inch above the surface.
- Do not include visible cords or wiring.
- Have lights that remain off throughout the ceremony.

Rehearsal Schedule

4:00–5:00 p.m. | Senior Memory Board & Table Setup

All senior displays must be completed during this time.

Display Guidelines:

- Each graduate will receive approximately three feet of table space.
- Please stay within your assigned area.
- The table will be covered with a black tablecloth. Families may add their own decorative cloth if desired.
- Candy, a guest book, and a card basket are welcome.
- Be sure your graduate's name is clearly displayed.
- Most tables do not have electrical outlets. Bring an extension cord if electricity is needed.
- Please review all wording and photos to ensure they honor both your family and the Christian values of our graduation ceremony.
- We ask that families refrain from displaying nude baby photos.

5:00–6:00 p.m. | Dinner

A light dinner will be provided.

6:45 p.m. | Full Graduation Rehearsal

We will rehearse the entire ceremony from beginning to end, including the diploma presentation and tassel ceremony.

Graduates will meet their parents on the church steps before going on stage. If anyone participating has difficulty using stairs, please notify us in advance so accommodations can be made.

Please plan to arrive on time and remain for the entire rehearsal.

We encourage families to bring a camera. Rehearsal provides an excellent opportunity to capture photos before graduation day.

Graduate Arrival

- Graduates should arrive no later than **9:00 a.m.**
- Graduates must be fully dressed in cap and gown and in the choir room by **9:30 a.m.**

Please leave all cell phones, smart watches, valuables, and personal belongings with your family. These items should not be brought on stage or left in the staging area.

Reminder about, dress code, ceremony expectations and photography guidelines:

- Graduates must follow the approved commencement dress code outlined in this handbook. Failure to meet the dress code requirements may result in being unable to participate in the ceremony.
- Graduates are expected to help maintain a respectful and distraction-free ceremony by leaving cell phones, food, drinks, gum, and other prohibited items behind.
- To ensure every family enjoys the ceremony, guests should remain seated during the program. Flash photography, standing in aisles, and blocking the view of others are not permitted.
- Our professional photographer will capture each graduate throughout the ceremony, allowing families to relax and fully enjoy this special milestone.

Commencement Ceremony

The **Commencement Ceremony will begin promptly at 10:00 a.m.**

The processional will begin at exactly **10:00 a.m.** To honor the graduates and ensure a respectful ceremony, the sanctuary doors will be **closed** once the procession begins.

Guests who arrive after 10:00 a.m. will be asked to wait outside the sanctuary until all graduates have completed the processional and are seated on stage. At that time, ushers will reopen the doors and assist late-arriving guests with seating.

We encourage all guests to arrive early and be seated before 10:00 a.m. so they do not miss this special moment as the graduating class makes its entrance.

Appendix D

Frequently Asked Questions

Can I decorate my graduation cap?

Yes! We encourage graduates to personalize their caps as a fun way to celebrate this milestone.

To ensure everyone's safety and maintain a polished appearance during the ceremony, please follow these guidelines:

- Decorations must remain entirely on the top surface of the cap.
 - Decorations may not extend more than **one inch** above the cap.
 - Lights are permitted only if they can remain **turned off throughout the ceremony**.
 - No visible wiring or cords may hang from the cap or gown.
 - Decorations should be appropriate and reflect the Christian values of the ceremony.

Can I wear honor cords or stoles?

Absolutely.

As the homeschooling parent, you determine whether your graduate has met the requirements to wear honor cords, stoles, or other academic regalia. PPEA provides suggested honor cord guidelines within this handbook, but we recognize the flexibility and individuality of each homeschool program.

Students participating in another homeschool program or college may also wear approved honor regalia earned through those programs.

Can grandparents sit in the reserved family section?

Yes.

You will receive six (6) reserved seats for the graduate's immediate family, including:

- Parents
- Siblings
- Grandparents

During the Presentation of the Diploma and Turning of the Tassel, parents will be invited to join their graduate on stage. Parents should sit on the aisle. Grandparents and siblings will remain seated and enjoy the presentation from their reserved seats.

Can I bring my own diploma?

Yes.

PPEA provides each graduate with a **Certificate of Participation** during the commencement ceremony. Since PPEA is not a diploma-granting institution, families are welcome to purchase or create their own diploma through the vendor of their choice and use it during the ceremony if they wish.

How can family and friends watch the ceremony if they can't attend?

The commencement ceremony will be professionally livestreamed so family and friends can celebrate from anywhere.

Approximately **two weeks after graduation**, families will also receive:

- A downloadable video of the ceremony
- A recording of the livestream
- Their graduate's professional photo gallery

Livestream links will be emailed to all graduating families prior to graduation day.

Where should guests park?

Complimentary parking is available at **Starkey Road Baptist Church**.

After the ceremony, guests should exit using the **86th Avenue entrance**, which leads directly to the traffic signal on Starkey Road. This traffic pattern helps everyone leave the campus safely and efficiently.

Please share this information with your guests before graduation day.

What happens if I miss a deadline?

Graduation planning involves many people, printed materials, photographers, venue staff, and volunteers. Because of this, meeting deadlines is extremely important.

Missing a submission deadline may result in:

- Information being omitted from the graduation program.
- Photos not being included in presentations or printed materials.
- Delays in completing your graduation registration.

Missing mandatory events, such as the Graduation Brunch or Graduation Rehearsal, may affect a student's ability to participate in the commencement ceremony.

If an unexpected emergency arises, please contact the PPEA as soon as possible. While we cannot guarantee exceptions, we will do our best to work with families whenever circumstances allow.

How many guests may attend the ceremony?

There is **no limit** to the number of guests you may invite to celebrate your graduate's special day.

The commencement ceremony is open to family and friends. Reserved seating is available for immediate family, while additional guests will be seated in the general seating areas on a first-available basis.

We encourage guests to arrive early. The **processional begins promptly at 10:00 a.m.**, and the sanctuary doors will close once the processional starts. Late-arriving guests will be seated after all graduates have entered and are seated on stage.
